With the combination of low unemployment, the further widening skills gap, and the accelerated path of automation and data exchange in almost every industry, economic developers are

struggling to attract companies due to the lack of identifiable specific skill sets. Moreover, students are being prepared for jobs that will not exist when they are ready to enter the workforce, further negatively impacting the workforce pipeline. How then do economic developers assist with developing their regions' workforce skills' and pivot to marketing skill sets versus jobs?

Using available free on-line tools, we will look at translating a regions occupational clusters into skill set clusters, and discuss programs such as Innovate-Educate, WorkforceREVEAL, and other programs that are focusing on skills training versus job training, and ultimately show how you can implement these programs in your region.
